

# WHGNE's Strengths-Based Socioecological Model

The socioecological model shows the various levels and areas in which prevention activities can take place. In our model, we are highlighting the prevention of gender-based violence through our own work here at WHGNE.

Some of our prevention activities are directly linked to promoting gender equality and thus contributing to the prevention of gender-based violence.

Other activities are aimed at addressing things like social inequity, the impacts of climate change or issues of health and social cohesion - these contribute to prevention by increasing community wellbeing and targeting inequity, discrimination and some of the unique factors that produce gendered outcomes in rural and regional settings (like climate-based emergencies or inaccessible healthcare).
